




NEW: Bitcoin Electronic Waste Monitor












One bitcoin transaction: 509 Kwh of electricity

The root problem with conventional currency is all the trust that's required to make it work. 

% who trust the govt in Washington always or most of the time




"Do you trust the government in Washington to do the right thing all or most of the time?" 77% in 1964, 18% in 2017.










Do you approve or disapprove of marriage between blacks and whites?





Do you think marriages between same-sex couples should or should not be recognized by the law as valid, with the same rights as traditional marriages?









Shooting Spurs Hashtag Effort on Stereotypes




Tyler Atkins posted these pictures on Twitter and suggested that the news media would select the one on the left to depict him if he were shot.

When Tyler Atkins heard about the fatal shooting of Michael Brown, 18, an unarmed black teenager in Ferguson, Mo., he posted on Twitter a picture of himself in a tuxedo, with a saxophone around his neck, next to a photograph of himself dressed in a black T-shirt with a blue bandanna tied around his head and his finger pointed at the camera.

Like hundreds of young African-Americans, he placed his pictures under the hashtag <u>#IfTheyGunnedMeDown</u>, protesting Mr. Brown's killing by a police officer and the way young black men are depicted in the news media. He said that Mr. Brown's identity was distorted and filtered through negative stereotypes, and that the same would have been done to him with the bandanna image if he found himself the victim of a similar event.

The first picture was taken after a jazz concert at the High School for the Performing and Visual Arts in Houston, where Mr. Atkins, a senior, studies music. The other was taken during a recording for a <u>rap video</u> he made with friends for a school math project.




































